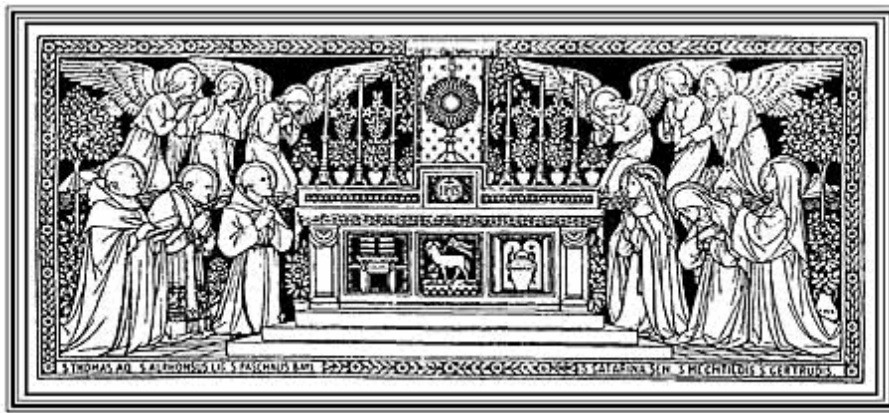


Tridentine Community News
